We are delighted to be starting a partnership with New York City Center, whose capabilities will allow us to heighten the theatricality of our presentations. We are proud to introduce *Bridges*, our new outreach program that will enable people, regardless of their abilities and backgrounds, to experience the joy of group music-making. We look forward to sharing more information with you soon about our inaugural *Bridges* performance in June 2016.

With these initiatives, **MasterVoices** enters a new era with renewed energy. I hope you will join us for one of our performances and be a part of this very special season in our organization's history!





Bridges is a new educational outreach initiative aimed at bringing people in a community together to make music, regardless of their abilities or backgrounds. This season, MasterVoices has commissioned composer Marisa Michelson—known for her mesmerizing, inventive, and accessible, but never derivative music—to create a work to highlight the unique sounds and skills of five highly diverse choruses from Lawrence, Long Island. These choruses include the St. John's Baptist Church chorus, La Iglesia de Nuestra Señora del Buen Consejo chorus, Hebrew Academy of Five Towns chorus, United Chorale Society, and Lawrence High School chorus. Witness the culmination of this year's program as MasterVoices performs in concert with these choruses from Lawrence in June 2016.



For 15 years, MasterVoices has made a difference in the lives of young people, equipping them with strong musical tools, expanding their horizons as citizens of the world, and teaching them to become lifelong enthusiastic audiences for the arts. THE COMPLIMENTARY TICKET PROGRAM brings hundreds of students from New York schools and community programs to MasterVoices' concert programs each year.

THE FAITH GEIER ARTIST INITIATIVE offers transformational opportunities for young and developing soloists to perform at top venues with internationally-renowned artists.
