"SATRIE IS WHAT CLOSES ON SATURDAY NIGHT"

Get ready for another Gershwin powerhouse! This rarely performed gem kicked off a masterful trio that came to include OF THEE I SING (performed by MasterVoices in 2017) and LET 'EM EAT CAKE (2019). Expect soaring melodies, infectious syncopation, and a healthy dose of silliness!

A pointed satire, the show's book (by George S. Kaufman and Morrie Ryskind) cries out to us from the 1920s about America's increasing love of money, fear of foreigners, and penchant for war. But the real point is the lush Gershwin score - the overture alone will make you swoon, plus "The Man I Love", "I've Got a Crush On You", and more. Artistic Director Ted Sperling has teamed with writer and theater historian Laurence Maslon to fashion an entirely new edition of the show, just for MasterVoices.

"GIVING VOICE TO THE VOICELESS"

At last, New York audiences have the chance to experience this riveting 2019 opera based on the true stories of six people, still living, who were unjustly accused and wrongfully imprisoned for crimes they didn't commit. Each was ultimately exonerated.

Based on the eponymous book by Mark Godsey and casework by the Ohio Innocence Project, a 12-member cast brings us the exonerees' stories in their own words, adapted by librettist David Cote to be both spoken and sung. Composer Scott Davenport Richards' score calls on jazz, funk, and hip-hop to help convey the stories' vastness and their particularity – the twisting of a child's words, being in the wrong place at the wrong time, bearing a passing resemblance to someone else. Commissioned by Cincinnati Opera in 2019, it has only grown more relevant since its premiere.

HISTORY

Founded in 1941 by legendary conductor Robert Shaw, MasterVoices broke barriers as "the melting pot that sings" - one of the nation's first interfaith, interracial choruses. Known as The Collegiate Chorale, we sang at the opening of the United Nations and recorded under the batons of Arturo Toscanini, Leonard Bernstein, and many more.

Over the years we expanded our repertoire to include opera, musical theater, and new commissions, premiering work by composers ranging from Philip Glass to Paul McCartney and refreshing "forgotten" work by Scott Joplin and Kurt Weill, among others.

In recent years our concerts have become increasingly interdisciplinary, with collaborations involving designers, choreographers, visual artists, actors, directors, and world class soloists. Our family has grown, thanks to expanded outreach and a vigorous commitment to diversity. Building on Shaw's founding vision, Artistic Director Ted Sperling has made us a true chorus for the 21st century.
